



CAMP & COVID 19

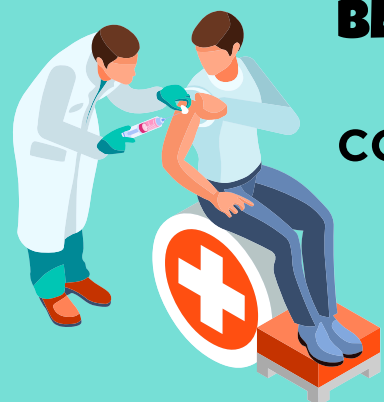
Camp Klotty Pine will look different in 2021 as we have modified our existing program to keep campers safe, healthy and having the time of their lives. Our team has worked diligently to create a safe summer camp experience. Each camper family is expected to commit to safety precautions to ensure a safe, fun, and meaningful camp experience!

We will continue to monitor the latest recommendations by the CDC, American Camping Association, and local health authorities. If our leadership team determines it is necessary to increase restrictions, or that it is safe to lessen restrictions by the time of camp, we will notify each family in writing of these changes. We ask you to please remember that the pandemic continues to be an evolving situation and we prioritize the safety of our camp community as a whole above all else.

Below is a list of the major changes that will be made to the operation of Camp Klotty Pine August 9-13, 2021:



BEFORE ARRIVING AT CAMP



COVID-19 TESTING

- Campers will be required to provide a negative COVID-19 test 5 days prior to traveling to camp.
- Campers will be given a rapid test for COVID-19 upon arrival to camp.
- All staff and counselors will be tested prior to and throughout their participation in camp.

QUARANTINE AND HEALTH SCREENING

- All Camp Turning Rivers staff and counselors will be required to quarantine at their camp facility prior to and throughout their participation in camp.
- Campers will be asked to minimize interactions outside of household when at all possible and track their temperature and any symptoms for 7 days prior to camp.
- All participants will be screened for COVID-19 symptoms upon arrival to camp facility and will participate in ongoing health screening throughout the week.



VACCINATIONS

- Although we cannot legally enforce or mandate any of the COVID-19 vaccinations available at this time, we strongly encourage all campers eligible to vaccinate do so prior to camp. Staff and volunteers will receive the full vaccination series for COVID-19, whenever possible.





TRANSPORTATION

- Campers will be required to get to Camp Klotty Pine on their own this year following quarantine guidelines (i.e. Shared rides between camper families is NOT allowed). No bus option will be offered.
- If this is a barrier to your camper attending camp please contact the Camp Director or your Hemophilia Treatment Center Social Worker to discuss options.



MASKS

All individuals at camp (campers, counselors, staff) will be required to wear a mask over their mouth and nose other than when sleeping, bathing, eating, drinking or swimming.



CAMPER COHORTS AND SOCIAL DISTANCING

- Campers will be grouped into small cohorts of 4-5 campers for the entirety of the program (including all activities, meals, free time, etc.).
- There will be dedicated staff for each cohort whom will remain with the same group of campers for the entire week of camp.
- All cohorts will maintain appropriate social distance (6 feet minimum) from other cohorts at all times.



ACTIVITIES

- All camp activities such as campfires, large group games, and morning password (if deemed safe) will be modified to maintain social distance between each cohort.
- We will enforce frequent, scheduled handwashing and enhanced cleaning procedures as part of our activity schedule.
- Activities will take place outdoors whenever possible. Whenever we need to be indoors (sleeping or inclement weather) we will ensure proper ventilation.
- Meals will be served school lunch style and campers will eat outside with their cohort.

IN THE EVENT OF A KNOWN OR SUSPECTED CASE OF COVID-19

- No camper or staff will be permitted to join the camp community if they test positive during pre-camp testing, show symptoms, or have a known exposure.
- If a camper or staff member shows symptoms or tests positive while at camp, they will be immediately isolated. All individuals in their cohort will also be isolated from the rest of the camp community and monitored.
- If your camper shows symptoms, tests positive, or is believed to have been exposed to COVID-19 at any time during camp, you will be notified immediately.
- Caregivers will be required to pick up their child from camp and transport them home or to an appropriate place to quarantine within 8 hours if they test positive or have shown symptoms of COVID-19.
